The School

The Walworth Barbour American International School in Israel (WBAIS) is a private, co-educational pre K-12 institution offering an American college preparatory program leading to a U.S. High School Diploma. Located in Even Yehuda, a residential district 20 kilometers north of Tel Aviv, the School was established in 1958 to meet the needs of American children whose parents are on government, business, or professional assignments in Israel. The school currently enrolls 566 students (192 high school students) and employs a faculty and staff of 102. WBAIS is located on a state of the art campus comprised of 8 buildings: separate preschool, elementary, middle, and high school buildings, a library and administration building, a double gymnasium, a fine and performing arts center, and a cafeteria. There are 7 fully equipped science laboratories, 3 regulation soccer/baseballs fields, a swimming pool, 4 tennis courts, and playgrounds.

In addition, the athletics program includes a wide variety of varsity and intramural sports such as: baseball, basketball, softball, soccer, tennis, cross country, floor hockey, swimming, and volleyball.

Accreditation

WBAIS is accredited by the Middle States Association of College and Schools.

The Faculty

The high school faculty consists of 39 educators who hold 18 master degrees and 6 doctoral degrees. The student:faculty ratio in the high school is approximately 5:1.

The Students

The total number of high school students is 193 including 42 Seniors, 56 Juniors, 55 Sophomores, and 40 Freshmen. 30% of the students hold U.S. citizenship; the rest come from over 36 countries.

The Program

WBAIS offers a competitive academic program to its high school students, which includes 17 AP courses and the AP Capstone Diploma Program. Graduates go on to study at American and international universities. Students are encouraged to fulfill a school/community service expectation. In addition, all seniors are required to complete a Senior Project or AP Senior Research consisting of research, practical experience, and a presentation before a panel of experts. School activities play an important role at AIS and include the following: Student Leadership, Model United Nations, Modern Language Clubs, Robotics, Yearbook, Drama Productions, Ecology Club, Language Honor Societies, "Bridge" Tech Club, National Honor Society, Queer Straight Alliance, Mother Tongue Program, and a Community Service Program.
